Dear Delegates

Given the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the Universities of KwaZulu Natal and the Durban University of Technology (which comprise the local organising committee of the 48th Annual Conference of the Anatomical Society of Southern Africa) has been forced to cancel our in-person meeting in Durban, KwaZulu Natal, South Africa that was scheduled from the 18th-21st April 2021. Instead, the congress will adopt a virtual format on 19th and 20th of April 2021. The committee has managed to prepare a program which, we trust will meet with the expectations of a usual congress.

Kindly note that the call for abstract submission has been closed.


