TEACHING AND LEARNING UPDATE

As from 1 June 2020, DUT began to offer multi-modal teaching and learning (T&L) across all levels of study. On 5 June, residences received final year students that require clinical training in their programmes. On 8 June, the University resumed blended T&L for this category of students only.

From 12 June 2020, residences began to receive the following categories of students:

- Students in the final year of their programmes, who are on a path to graduating in 2021, may return.
- Final year students, who require access to laboratories, technical equipment, data, connectivity and access to residence and private accommodation, should only return if they have been invited by their Faculties.
- Postgraduate students who require laboratory equipment and other technical equipment to undertake their studies.

Blended T&L, which entails integration of face-to-face and online T&L, will resume on 17 June 2020.

Students, who experience challenges in accessing online T&L material, will be provided with a 32GB USB memory stick, which is pre-loaded with learning material. This group of students must contact their academic department in advance, to request access to the USB devices with T&L material.

Please take note that **only students who have been invited** to return, should arrive on campus. No deviations from this will be tolerated.
