**UPDATE: COVID-19**

Whilst South Africa has eased the lockdown restrictions and regulations have been revised for Alert Level 1, the DUT COVID-19 Response Task Team urges all staff and students to continue to follow the public health guidelines to prevent the further spread of the disease. In the first eight days of this month, 12556 people were infected with COVID-19 in South Africa. Globally, more than 36.7 million people have now been infected and tragically, more than 1.06 million people have passed on. On a positive note, over 27.6 million people have recovered from the disease. Yesterday, South Africa confirmed 1736 new infections. Our country was 29<sup>th</sup> in the world for new daily infections and 8<sup>th</sup> in the world for total recoveries. Unfortunately, 160 people in South Africa passed on from COVID-19 related conditions yesterday. So please, do not lower your guard! You must continue to wear a mask, practice social and physical distancing, wash your hands with soap and water for a minimum of 20 seconds, use a 70% alcohol-based hand sanitiser and disinfect frequently touched surface areas.

Show your device, permit and student/staff card to campus security at the entrance gate and you will be given access to the campus. Please remember that the HealthCheck online form must be completed for each daily visit/attendance on campus.

## COVID-19 protocols are still in place at DUT

Although South Africa is currently on Alert Level 1 in the “State of Disaster” there is still a strong possibility of a second wave of infections. DUT continues to take the COVID-19 pandemic very seriously. For this reason, the following rules continue to apply:

- Always wear a mask on campus and in communal areas in residence.
- Please keep a minimum of 1.5 metres away from other people at all times.
- Thoroughly wash your hands for a minimum of 20 seconds with water and soap.
- Sanitise frequently touched surface areas.
- Do not touch your face with unwashed hands.
- Sneeze, cough or yawn into your bent elbow, even if you are using a mask.

The majority of staff will be returning to campus on Monday 12 October 2020. We remind our colleagues, as per the details above, to please use the **HealthCheck** online form **before** they arrive on campus. For those who are unable to use the online form, manual screening is in place at the entry gates. However, this could delay your entry onto campus, so please factor that into account when you arrive on Monday morning. Please be patient with our team at the screening points and entrances. Remember, they are working to help protect the health and safety of the entire DUT community.

In conclusion, we have a joint responsibility to limit and prevent the further spread of COVID-19. Therefore, please remain extremely careful, follow the guidelines and remember that the virus is still infecting people in our country.
