





The Disability Rights Unit (DRU) operates within the Department of Student Governance & Development under Student Services Sector to support students with disabilities at DUT. It provides appropriate advice and academic support to students with disabilities within its available means, thereby making access to education fair and equitable.

Services offered:

- General advocacy for students living with disabilities.
- Support for students to navigate and liaise with academic environment.
- Liaison with financial resources available, residence accommodation, registrations, etc.
- · Referrals to psychotherapy and psychological services (eg for time concessions, evaluations, etc)
- Assisting students when applying for disability-related needs or services such as Human Support, Interpreters and Scribes.

What is expected of students?

- · Register with the Disability Rights Unit as early as possible
- Provide documentation that detail your disability-related needs (academic, accommodation, etc)
- Make timely applications for tests, practicals and examination arrangements.
- All requests to be submitted to the DRU.

What is most important?

Students are encouraged to be proactive and not wait until late to ask for help. They must communicate. Reach out. Be engaged. Join students with disability groups. Join disability-friendly sports.
