COVID-19 RESPONSE TASK TEAM WEEKLY UPDATE

Dear staff and students

With COVID-19 infections currently decreasing countrywide, the emphasis now is on preventing a serious fourth wave of the pandemic, by encouraging everyone who qualifies, to get fully vaccinated as soon as possible. The scientific data is clear; according to Johns Hopkins University and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, vaccines significantly protect people from severe disease, hospitalisation and death as a result of COVID-19.

In fact, the Centres for Disease Control (CDC) reports that **unvaccinated people have died at 11 times the rate of fully vaccinated individuals** since the Delta variant became the dominant strain in the USA. The research, which was published in The British Medical Journal (*The BMJ*), also highlighted that **vaccinated people were 10 times less likely to be admitted to hospital** and **five times less likely to be infected** than unvaccinated people (https://www.bmj.com/content/374/bmj.n2282).

Don't hesitate. Vaccinate!

With the end-of-year holiday season fast approaching, it's not too late to get vaccinated against COVID-19 to allow you to enjoy a safer festive season with your family and friends. The good news is that DUT has extended its #VaccinationThursdays campaign, due to demand from students and staff. For quick and easy vaccination with the Johnson & Johnson vaccine, please visit the DUT Isolempilo Clinic on the Steve Biko campus on a Thursday, from 08h30 to 15h00. You don't need to make an appointment. Just take your staff/student card and your ID.

If you would prefer the Pfizer vaccine, please call the Clinic during office hours on 031 373 2223 to make a firm appointment or email covid-enquiries@dut.ac.za for more information. If you are due for your second dose of the Pfizer vaccine, please contact the Isolempilo Clinic during office hours on 031 373 2223 to make an appointment. Everyone, vaccinated or not, is asked to please continue to follow the **basic precautions** of wearing a mask, social distancing and practising good hand hygiene. This is because the COVID-19 vaccines, like all vaccines, do not offer 100% protection against catching COVID-19. However, they do significantly reduce your chances of contracting the disease or passing it on to others.







If DUT can reach maximum vaccination of students and staff, we can begin to return to more in-person events and teaching and learning and start to attain new kind of 'normal' for our university.


