Everything you need to know to visit campus safely

As students, faculty and staff prepare to return to campus, here is the information you'll need to return to our shared spaces safely and to make a smooth transition back to in-person learning.

Mandatory requirements for entry to campus:

You need a permit to enter campus

Only those invited onto campus will be allowed to visit campus.

All persons accessing DUT campuses must be in possession of a valid permit issued by their Faculty/Programme/Department.

You need a valid student/staff card

Staff and registered students require an access card to enter campus. Only those who have been invited to campus are eligible for a student/staff card. Please contact Protection Services in this regard.

Be vaccinated or tested

All individuals accessing campus or participating in in-person university activities off campus must be vaccinated against COVID-19, OR produce a negative PCR test which will be valid for 7 days, OR have received an approved exemption from the University. This is in line with the Three Choices Vaccination Policy approved by DUT Council in December 2021, and applies to all students, staff and visitors to DUT campuses.

On-campus vaccination is available every Thursday from 08h30 to 14h30 at the Isolempilo Clinic on the Steve Biko campus. Please email your enquiries to covid-enquiries@dut.ac.za

Wear a well-fitted mask

Every person on DUT property is required to wear a well-fitted mask at all times covering the mouth, nose and chin.

Complete a daily health check

Before each visit to campus, all students, staff, contractors and visitors must complete a <u>mandatory health</u> <u>screening</u> check called HealthCheck before being granted access to campus. You can access HealthCheck in three ways:

If you obtain a green result, you may proceed to campus.

At entrances to campus, please show Security personnel:

Your vaccination certificate OR negative PCR test result that is no longer than seven days old;

Your valid student/staff card;

Your permit to visit campus; and

Your green HealthCheck result.

Let's keep DUT safe

DUT is committed to protecting the health and safety of all members of our community. We all have a role to play in minimising the spread of COVID-19 on campus.

Please:

- Get vaccinated
- Stay at home if you are ill
- Wear a well-fitted mask
- Practise good hand and respiratory hygiene (cough and sneeze into the crook of your arm and keep your hands clean)
- Ensure windows and doors are open for maximum ventilation
- Keep your distance from others to minimise the spread of COVID-19
