UPDATE ON CAMPUS OPERATIONS IN DURBAN

Earlier today, the Durban High Court granted DUT an interim interdict following the violent protest action that affected Steve Biko Campus, Ritson Campus, M.L Sultan Campus and City Campus last Thursday.

The South African Police Services have also been officially notified about the latest court order. As a result, we have evaluated the risks and decided to reopen the four Durban campuses that were temporarily closed last week.

Therefore, the Steve Biko Campus, Ritson Campus, M.L Sultan Campus and City Campus will **reopen** tomorrow, Wednesday, **30 March 2022**.
