HE GAVE up a good job as a cameraman at a leading broadcaster to do what he loves the most.

Andile Buwa has become a successful scriptwriter, producer and director. He also has a diploma in Video Technology from Durban University of Technology.

He told *Daily Sun* he's been in the industry for a few years.

He's ready to guide aspiring youths who want to make it as film artists.
