- Present a landscape of the literature that you reviewed to support the need for this study – summarising the blind spots and gaps that your research will contribute to within the identified discourse

- Present an analysis of the literature that you reviewed showing where the current discourse is

- Presents the theoretical framework/s that will inform your study and argue for why it/they are relevant to your study

- Present the main constructs of your theoretical framework and argue for how these constructs will guide your data production and analysis

- Present your research paradigm
 - Your research approach
 - Your research methodology

Slide 10

- Show how the participants will be selected
 - What info is needed and
 - What instruments will be used to produce the data

- Indicate some of the limitations of the study and how you plan to minimize the impact these limitations of the production of the data and the analysis thereof
 - Present a brief indication of validity and reliability issues and identify any biases that may present itself within the data production and analysis process
